




RULES FOR MOOT COURT COMPETITION

ELIGIBILITY & REGISTRATION RULES

- 1. Team members must be undergraduate students enrolled in a recognized Bachelor of Law program, whether a 3-year LL.B course or a 5-year integrated B.A. LL.B / B.B.A. LL.B program.
- 2.Only Colleges/Institutions recognized by the Bar Council of India are eligible to participate in the CPJ National Moot Court Competition 2025.

TEAM COMPOSITION

- 1. Each eligible College/Institution may send a maximum of two teams to the competition. If more than two teams register from the same institution only the first two valid entries will be accepted. However, in cases where multiple registrations are received priority shall be given to the two teams that submit an authorization letter from the Head/Dean of the Institution or the Convener of the Moot Court Committee. All other entries will stand rejected.
- 2. Each team shall comprise three law students: two speakers & one researcher.
- 3. Any changes to the Team Composition shall be intimated to the Organizers before the Formal Registration at the Venue.

DRESS CODE

- 1. The prescribed dress code for the competition is formal Moot Court attire.
- 2. **Boys:** Black suit with a white shirt & a black tie.
- 3. Girls: White shirt with black trousers/skirt & a black Blazer, or a Salwar Kameez with a black Blazer.
- 4. Gowns & bands are not permitted to be worn by the participants.

MEMORIALS SUBMISSION

- 1. Each team is required to prepare written briefs & oral arguments to argue for both sides of the case.
- 2. The Court shall follow its own procedure within the accepted norms of judicial practice. In case of any doubt or dispute regarding procedure or facts, the decision of the presiding member of the Panel of Judges shall be final.
- 3. A soft copy of the Memorials for both the Petitioner & the Respondent must be submitted to the Convener at nmcc2025@cpj.edu.in on or before 8th of November, 2025.
- 4. Additionally, each team is required to submit five (5) hard copies of the Memorials for both the Petitioner and the Respondent at the college address on or before 10th November 2025.
- 5. The Memorials will be handed over to the Panel of Judges for evaluation & award of marks.
- 6. The Memorials shall not contain any information that may disclose the identity of the participating team. Any violation of this rule shall attract a penalty.





MEMORIAL CONTENT & FORMATTING

- 1. Each team shall prepare Memorials for both the Petitioner & the Respondent, addressing:
 - Table of Contents
- List of Abbreviations
- Index of Authorities/ List of References
- Statement of Jurisdiction
- Statement of Facts (*Not exceeding 2 pages*)
- 2. The Memorial shall not exceed 40 pages.
- 3. FORMATTING SPECIFICATIONS:

FOR MAIN TEXT

- Language: English
- Font (General): Times New Roman, size 12
- Line Spacing (General): 1.5 lines

- Statement of Issues
- Summary of Arguments (Not exceeding 2 pages)
- Arguments Advanced
- Prayer (Not exceeding 1 page)

FOR FOOTNOTES

- Font (Footnotes): Times New Roman, size 10
- Line Spacing (Footnotes): Single line
- Page Margins: 1 inch on all sides

Teams shall cite authorities in the memorial with footnotes following a uniform system of citation (Bluebook 20th Edition). Pages should be numbered at the bottom & spaced in the middle of each page of the memorial.

4. COVER PAGE SPECIFICATION:

- Team Code in the upper right hand corner.
- Name & Place of the forum.
- Name of the Parties & their status.
- **Petitioner** Blue cover & **Respondent** Red cover

RESEARCHER TEST & EVALUATION

- 1. The Best Researcher shall be chosen through a Researcher Test conducted in the morning after the formal registration of the teams is duly completed. Teams comprising three members, i.e., two speakers & one researcher, are eligible for the Researcher Test. Teams consisting of only two members are not eligible.
- 2.A quorum of judges shall be selected for each court from among a panel constituted for the competition, including eminent Judges, Lawyers, & Law Teachers from across India.
- 3. Memorials shall be evaluated by the Panel of Judges out of a maximum of 100 marks. Each court shall award marks for the oral rounds to both individual participants and the team. The individual score will be determined by combining the marks obtained in the oral rounds and the memorial evaluation making a total of 200 marks.
- 4. The distribution of marks for each individual participant is as follows:

Oral Arguments		Knowledge of facts, Articulation of Facts & Issues, Legal Analysis, Use of Evidence, Authorities & Citations, Response to questions, Advocacy skills & Persuasiveness, Language, Style, Clarity, Brevity & Ingenuity, Court Manners & Overall Impression

Total = 200 Marks

EVALUATION & PRIZES

- 1. Marks shall be awarded on agreed criteria by the Committee of Judges. Performance shall be assessed under the factors "Excellent," "Good," "Average" & "Poor." The decision of the Committee of Judges shall be final.
- 2. Individual prizes will be awarded on the basis of the total marks secured by the participant.

ORAL ROUNDS

- 1. The order of the competition, including the days & the side (Petitioner/Respondent) for which each team will appear, shall be determined by drawing lots prior to the commencement of the competition during the briefing session. The scheme of the competition, once drawn, will be notified to all participating teams.
- 2. The Moot Court Society reserves the right to make necessary alterations regarding the side to be argued by competing teams if required due to:
 - Withdrawal of any team at the last minute, or
 - Ensuring that all teams have had the opportunity to argue both sides of the problem.
- 3. The host team, if it qualifies for the finals shall not be eligible to participate in the final round.

TIME ALLOTMENT

1. Preliminary & Quarter Rounds

- The total duration shall be 60 minutes (30 minutes per team).
- Each team shall be allotted 30 minutes, inclusive of rebuttals/sur-rebuttals.
- A maximum of 5 minutes may be reserved for rebuttal/sur-rebuttal.
- Each speaker must speak for not less than 10 minutes.

2. Semi-Finals & Finals

- The total duration shall be 80 minutes (40 minutes per team).
- Each team shall be allotted 40 minutes, inclusive of rebuttals/sur-rebuttals.
- A maximum of 5 minutes may be reserved for rebuttal/sur-rebuttal.
- Each speaker must speak for not less than 15 minutes.
- If any speaker exceeds his/her allotted time, the excess shall be deducted from the time allocated to the cospeaker or from the rebuttal/sur-rebuttal time, as the case may be.
- The final decision on time structure & the right to rebuttal/sur-rebuttal rests with the Judges.

GENERAL RULES FOR ORAL ROUNDS

- 1. During the oral rounds, the use of electronic devices such as laptops, mobile phones & tablets shall not be permitted.
- 2. Strict decorum must be maintained in the courtroom at all times. Any form of misbehavior, prompting, or disturbance shall lead to immediate disqualification at the discretion of the Judges/Organizing Committee.
- 3. No team shall disclose its institutional identity to the Judges or Court Officers during the rounds; such disclosure may attract penalty or disqualification.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Secrecy of Identity: Participants must not reveal their identity or institution; violations will lead to disqualification.
- Appeal Committee: Complaints shall be submitted to the Appellate Committee (Dr. Shalini Tyagi, Convener, & Co-Convener of the Moot Court Society) decisions are final. No marksheet/ Scoresheet will be shown to any participants/ teams in any case whatsoever.
- **Misconduct:** Eve-teasing or misbehavior will lead to immediate disqualification & legal action if necessary.
- The organizing Committee has the exclusive rights to decide in case of any dispute related to the registration. The decision of the Organizing Committee in such a case shall be Final.
